

## Robert Baden-Powell & The Scouts

- 1) During a quite cold and frosty morn  
On the 22nd February 1857 Robert Baden-Powell was born  
Though not doing any school work in a hurry  
He was brought up in Charterhouse School in Surrey
- 2) Baden-Powell became a Lieutenant-general in the British Army in 1876 to 1910  
Facing dangerous battle time and time again  
Through this experience he learnt a lot without debate  
And wrote the book 'Scouting for Boys' in 1908
- 3) Baden-Powell had the first experimental camp in 1907 yes  
Which lots of children were interested in or so I guess  
Soon the world wide Scouts and Guides were to be run  
Bringing boys and girls lots of camp lessons and fun
- 4) Baden-Powell was made Chief Scout of the World after a while  
Bringing to lots of children enjoyment and a smile  
Helping them learn more and more  
Rather than just sit back with a bit of a bore
- 5) In 1912 Baden-Powell got married to his wife  
Bringing also the children Peter, Heather and Betty into their life  
He was to continue to help develop the Scouts and Guides for ages  
Until his sad death in 1941, aged 83, made all the front pages
